EPGY is respected nationally and internationally for developing and offering academic and highly challenging courses. On Thursday, November 15, 2007, EPGY speakers will present up-to-date information and leave time for attendees to ask questions.

There are currently over 4,000 students from over fifteen countries currently enrolled with EPGY, and over 60,000 students have participated since inception in 1985.

Kindergarten through twelfth grade students may enroll in EPGY throughout the calendar year and have access to courses in a variety of subjects from kindergarten to university level. Examples of subjects offered are: mathematics, physics, literature and writing, computer science, and music. Students take these courses on the computer, and they can be part of a home-based or school-based program. High school students may take single courses or enroll in EPGY's On-line high school.

In addition to EPGY's online courses, EPGY also offers intensive residential Summer Institutes. Last year almost 1,000 students from over forty countries attended EPGY's three or four week residential summer programs for academically talented and motivated youth, and they enjoyed a taste of college life on the Stanford campus.

Speakers will include Ray Ravaglia and Rick Sommer, Deputy Directors of EPGY, and Vicki Hobel Schultz, Parent Liaison and gifted advocate.
